

3. Curriculum

- Most of the subjects you will take are decided by the Government. This is called the National Curriculum;
- In Foundation Stage (Reception and Nursery) you will learn about lots of interesting facts through the four prime areas of learning;
- In Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and 2) you learn about all areas of the curriculum including maths, English and science. At the end of KS1 you will be tested using the QCA SATs tests in reading, writing, maths and science.
- In Key Stage 2 (Years 3 to Year 6) you learn about all areas of the curriculum including maths, English and science. At the end of KS2 you will be tested using the QCA SATs tests in reading, writing, maths and science.

How will my work be organised to meet my individual needs?

- In many subjects you will be taught in a group which matches your levels and needs, this may be part of the main class or in individual groups;
- Work will be differentiated to match your way of learning and the levels which you are to achieve;
- Targets will be set to challenge your learning, these will be aspirational (something to work towards) but not out of your reach;
- Class teachers, teaching assistants and Headteacher will all be around to help you reach your targets and support your individual needs.
